Compliance Committee Announcements

The speed limit on Concho is posted 30 MPH.

- Yellow lines separate two lanes of traffic moving in opposite directions. **If there are two solid yellow lines, this means you are not allowed to pass the car in front of you by crossing into oncoming traffic. A double yellow line indicates that passing is not allowed from either side of the road.**
- There is no passing allowed on Concho
- The remainder of the roads in Valle Vista are 25 MPH per Arizona Speed Limit website:

- **Arizona Speed Limit - Residential Areas**

The maximum speed limit on residential roads in Arizona is 25 miles per hour. Residential roads have the most potential for speed-based accidents and collisions, so residential districts tend to have the lowest speed limits with the most strict enforcement policies.

Here in Valle Vista, you need to be on the lookout for walkers and golf carts; please be courteous and share the road.

When you encounter a school bus:

- Slow down! School buses make frequent stops, so be patient and drive at a reasonable speed.
- Be alert.
- Come to a complete stop at least 20 feet away from the bus.
- Be extra careful to look around before moving your vehicle, as children may be walking in front of, behind, or on the side of school buses.
- No vehicle may proceed until the bus resumes motion and has turned off the red warning lights.
- You must stop before meeting or overtaking a school bus loading or unloading passengers on a two-lane roadway.

Please slow down and be aware and considerate of others who are on the road.

Library News by Diane Druian

My husband's brother had the same enthusiasm for books as my husband and I have. He had many books on his area of scholarship: cultural anthropology, and many on Judaic history as well as other items that caught his eye at the numerous book sales he attended. He had a desire to be a novelist and took several creative writing courses over a span of many years. His instructors always had a list of books they thought the students should read. He acquired and read the books and he kept most of them. We lost him to illness a few years ago and had the daunting task of sorting through his massive collection which we sorted into donations to several libraries in his town and into a much-too-large-pile to add to our collection of TBR (To Be Read) books.

Among the writing course books which came to our house was a mystery novel by Margaret Maron titled **One Coffee With** which was her first book. I believe that was the point of including it in the coursework. I eventually found time to read it and met Sigrid Harald, a New York City police detective, who solved crimes and dealt with the obstacles of being a woman working in what was at the time a predominantly male profession. It was published in 1981. I enjoyed the book and liked the characters and enjoyed the depiction of the art world that was integral to the plot.

Despite my enjoyment, I never followed up on the rest of the series. Too many TBR books at home, I guess. But recently I came across an article about authors who died in 2021 and found out more about Margaret Maron who passed away in February of that year. Born and raised in North Carolina, she met her naval-officer husband during a summer secretarial position at the Pentagon. After a three-year tour of duty in Italy, they moved to Brooklyn, NY and her first book was influenced by her life in Brooklyn and especially things she observed and experienced as she worked in the art department at Brooklyn College. All the Harald mysteries take place over the course of a year in Sigrid's life, despite being published from 1981 to 2017. (The next to the last book was published in 1995 and **Take Out**, which wrapped up the series in 2017 answered the many readers who wanted to know if Sigrid would find true peace of mind in the end.)

The author and her family moved back to North Carolina in 1972 and her second series of books featuring Deborah Knott as the main character began with **Bootlegger's Daughter**, published in 1992. It was a huge success, winning Maron all four of the major awards for a mystery writer. In this book Deborah is a legal aid lawyer running for a judgeship in North Carolina. By the second book she had become a judge and as the series continued for 19 more

books, Maron explored racial prejudice, domestic abuse and other aspects of modern life in her home state. She also intertwined the two books series. In **Three-day Town**, published in 2011, Deborah Knott has been asked to deliver a package to Lt. Sigrid Harald of the NYPD. Sigrid is related to a character in the Deborah Knott series through Sigrid's Southern grandmother.

Two of the Deborah Knott series are in the Mohave County Library in Valle Vista. Sound recordings and books from both series are available from other branches as well as two stand-alone novels. The entire Mohave County Library catalog is available on the Internet at www.mohavecountylibrary.us. With your library card and PIN you can place a hold on a book either here in our local collection or from another library in the library district and have it brought to Valle Vista for you to pick up. Or call the library at (928)692-7662 and ask library staff to assist you in finding the books you want.

We always look forward to seeing you at the library. I did not get to start this series with the first book but I found that Tremayne succeeds in making each book stand on its own with sufficient explanation and repetition to help the reader understand Sister Fidelma's rank and the position that qualifies her to examine the crimes that are the central focus of each mystery. To find the order of books in this (or other) series, go to the library website at www.mohavecountylibrary.us. On the left side of the screen move down and click on "Learning and Research". In the drop-down menu, choose "Books, Authors and Writing". Click on "Novelist Plus". Use your library card number as your Patron ID to log in. Then you can enter an author name in the search space and find books by that author in date order from most recent to oldest. Mohave County libraries own nineteen Sister Fidelma books. There are thirty-two in the series and another scheduled for release this year.

The entire Mohave County Library catalog is available on the Internet at www.mohavecountylibrary.us. With your library card and PIN you can place a hold on a book either here in our local collection or from another library in the library district and have it brought to Valle Vista for you to pick up. Or call the library at (928)692-7662 and ask library staff to assist you in finding the books you want.
