



FOOD DRIVE IN VALLE VISTA



When the author of a biography is also the subject of that biography, the book is called an autobiography. A memoir is a type of autobiography. I promised you would find out the difference between an autobiography and a memoir in this month's Library News. Here is what my research discovered.

These differences are suggested on a website called bookriot.com.



Autobiographies	Memoirs
Cover the author's entire life	Usually cover only part of the author's life
Usually about famous people and readers are attracted to them to learn about that famous person	Can be about anybody. People read them because of their subject, theme or style.
Usually written in chronological order from birth to present day	Can be chronological but often move back and forth in time
Place greater emphasis on facts and history	Place greater emphasis on emotional experience: thoughts, feelings, reactions, and inner struggles

Another answer was simply that if the author covers his life from birth right up to the time he is finishing his book, the publisher would call it an autobiography. If the author is choosing to describe just a few experiences in his life and writing to explain what he has

learned about an issue such as overcoming substance abuse, for example, the publisher would call that a memoir.

But I have to admit that this seems to me to be a distinction without a difference as far as a reader is concerned. So let's examine some autobiographies or memoirs from our Mohave County libraries.

And this Halloween month, don't forget that some autobiography authors use

Ghost Writers to help them complete their books. After all, being famous doesn't make the person a good writer even if he has an exciting life to describe.

The Story of My Life by Helen Keller was published in 1903 when Keller was only 22 years old but the work accomplished by Helen and her Teacher at that point was profound. Having lost her sight and her hearing at a very young age, Helen needed specialized help to learn how to use her remaining senses and skills to interact and learn. Fortunately her father was referred to Alexander Graham Bell. He took her to Bell to seek advice on helping find a teacher. Bell recommended Anne Sullivan and continued to mentor Helen Keller for the rest of his life.

Clapton: the autobiography by Eric Clapton is an example of the diverse nature of the Biography Section. The legendary guitarist recounts the story of his life and his career recalling his work with the Yardbirds, Cream, and as a solo artist and revisits his years of drug and alcohol abuse, the accidental death of his young son. Clapton was 62 when he wrote this book and thinking about the changes in his life. A reviewer on Goodreads says, "Perhaps as inspiring as his journey through addiction and the creation of the Crossroads Center in Antigua is his

vivid descriptions of the people who inspired his music. I love his bluesy sound and now, knowing what inspired him, I find myself reaching to musicians I had never heard of before and immersing myself into a whole new musical world of blues and jazz. An excellent read, even if you don't know or particularly care for Clapton. The music history and journey and triumph of addiction are classic themes."

As I have said before, Biography is exciting! I'll have more from the Biography Section next month. Meanwhile have a great October and don't let the Ghost Writers get you.

A LETTER TO THE EDITOR

I have enjoyed living here in Valle Vista for more than twenty years. Just in the past year or two however, in traveling on Concho especially, I am seeing more and more drivers traveling at excessive speeds and exhibiting reckless behavior.

My wife calls me "Mister Law and Order" because I refuse to exceed the speed limit. On the one hand, I am simply obeying the law. Beyond that, however, I understand the reason that speed limits exist. Every roadway has its potential for problems. The more numerous the potential problems, the lower the speed limit. Concho is the central avenue through this entire community. It winds and wanders, creating curves that obscure any potential hazards ahead or oncoming traffic. Side streets and private drives are one source of potential problems, but there are many others. Service and delivery vehicles, pedestrians, bicyclists, children playing, and our beloved pets.

The speed limit on Concho is 30 mph, with 25 mph limits on all side streets. Those limits have <u>not</u> been set in order to "inconvenience" anyone. Rather, it has been established that greater speed simply isn't safe! Yet, there seems to be an ever increasing number of motorists here that are demonstrating a very reckless attitude.

I am annoyed when I am driving on Concho at the required 30 mph limit and another vehicle comes up behind me at a high rate of speed and follows too closely. Occasionally, some will actually cross the double yellow line to pass me, compounding the danger, and then continue speeding on ahead. Concho is an avenue through a residential neighborhood, not a two-lane highway, and should not be treated as such.

Far, far too much blood and tragedy occur every year due to motor vehicle accidents. And, many of those accidents were simply the result of excessive speed and reckless behavior. The Mohave County Sheriff's Department does not have the resources to patrol our community endlessly, but they do respond to complaints. Their non-emergency number is 928-753-0753. When you are passed on Concho by a speeder or witness reckless driving, call and let them know.

Valle Vista is not a large community, and I estimate that obeying the speed limits might delay someone five minutes or so in arriving at their destination. Is risking lives in order to gain a few minutes a reasonable bet? You decide. Pass the word. Let's try to make our community a little safer.
